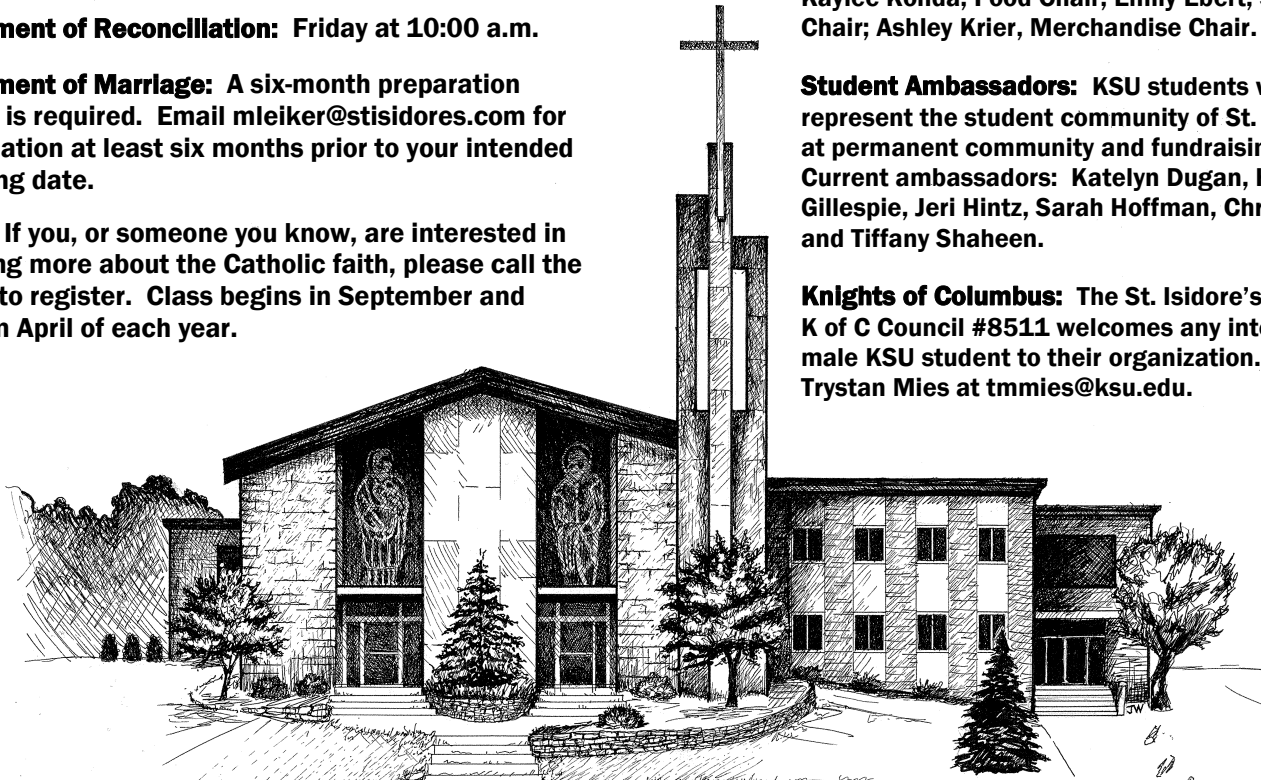

Listening Session for Young Adult Catholics

Young Adults: *The next Synod of Bishops in Rome is on the topic of "Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment." In preparation for the Synod, Pope Francis has asked that each diocese enter into a consultation with teenagers and young adults to determine their concerns, issues, and interests. I will not be making a presentation or responding to issues surfaced. Rather, I am directed solely to listen to you, the Catholic young adults of our community, to discern your views on these issues. In light of that approach, I will be hosting a listening session for young adults on **September 5th at St. Isidore's Catholic Student Center, starting at 7:30 p.m., followed by Mass. I will hold an identical listening session the week before at the Comeau Catholic Student Center in Hays on August 30th, at 7:00 p.m., followed by Mass. Following these listening sessions, I will be forwarding a report to the Holy See.***

Issues we will address are related to: the main challenges and opportunities for young Catholic people in our Diocese; common concerns young adults struggle with; what young people are seeking from the Church today; how our Catholic Student Centers contribute to young adult's formation and vocation discernment; young adults interaction with clergy; ways in which young adults can partake in the life of the community; interactions with friends and family members who have left the Church; and most importantly, identifying the key issues the Church should be looking at today from the perspective of young adults.
