RCIA: If you, or someone you know, are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please call the office to register. Class begins in September and ends in April of each year.

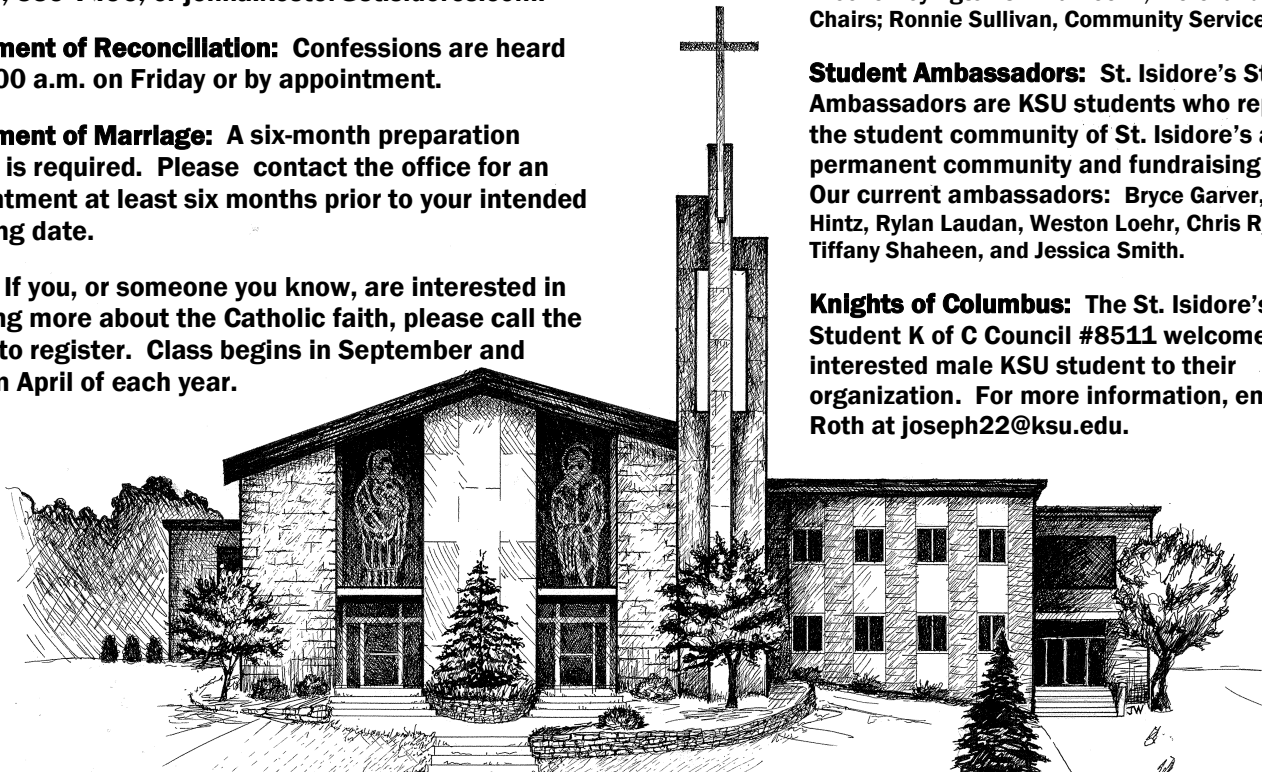

Renowned Scholar to Give Presentation

The International Dominican Foundation USA will host the distinguished Dominican biblical scholar Fr. Marcel Sigrist, Director of the Ecole Biblique in Jerusalem during his four city speaking tour through America. He will be speaking in New York, Oklahoma, Kansas and Florida to promote the projects being done in Jerusalem at the Ecole Biblique. This is done in collaboration with St. Joseph's Church in Greenwich Village, the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, St. Isidore's Catholic Student Center at Kansas State University and St. Leo's University in Florida. This is a unique opportunity to see and hear one of the world's leading scholars on Catholic Biblical research and on the Holy Land. Lecture Schedule:

"The Dominican Presence in the Holy Land: 1250 to Today": From the beginning of the Dominican Order in 1216 it was the intention to have a foothold in the Land of Jesus. Jordan of Saxony started this project but died in Acre near Syria in 1237. Much later in the 1700's, the Italian Dominicans went to Mosul where they opened schools and Catholic churches. Later the French Dominicans made foundations in Iraq. But in 1880 Father Lagrange and the French Dominicans started the Ecole Biblique in Jerusalem as a center totally devoted to the study of the Bible, even to this day.

"Jesus and Joseph, the Hidden Story": In the New Testament accounts, we see that Joseph never pronounced one single word. This hidden story of his silence is contrasted with his actions and obedience to the word of the angel. His hidden story helped to make possible the realization of God's plan of salvation. Joseph is the one who fulfills all that is announced in the Old Testament and ushers in all that is proclaimed in the New Testament.
