RCIA: If you, or someone you know, are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please call the office to register. Class begins in September and ends in April of each year.

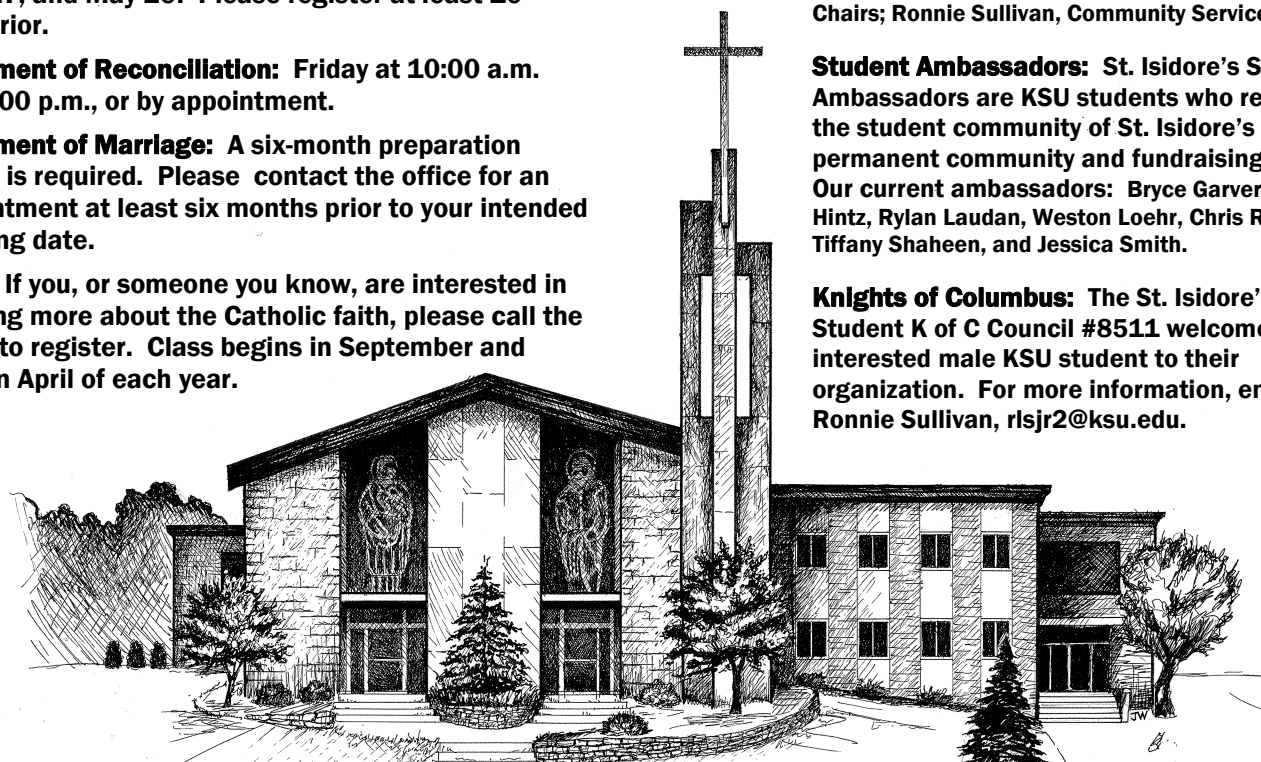

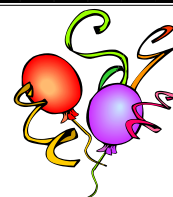

A time to strip away what holds us back from God, what is not genuine and true to who we are called to be. Statement of Penance, Fasting, Abstinence

The Bishops of the United States remind us that since we are not exempt from sinfulness, we should not consider ourselves exempt from penance. Traditional forms of penance are: abstinence from meat, fasting from food, other practices of self-denial, acts of religion (increased prayer life, participation in daily Mass and other devotions, spiritual reading), or other acts of charity and Christian witness. The Church's teaching regarding penance during Lent is as follows:

- * **Both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are days of fast and abstinence from meat.
- * **Abstinence** means not eating meat. The obligation of abstinence begins at the age of 14.
- * **Fasting** means eating only one full meal a day, with the other two meals being without meat and together not equaling a full meal. The obligation of fasting begins at the age of 18 and ends at 60.
- * **Fridays of Lent** are days of abstinence from meat.
