RCIA: If you, or someone you know, are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please call the office to register. Class begins in September and ends in April of each year.

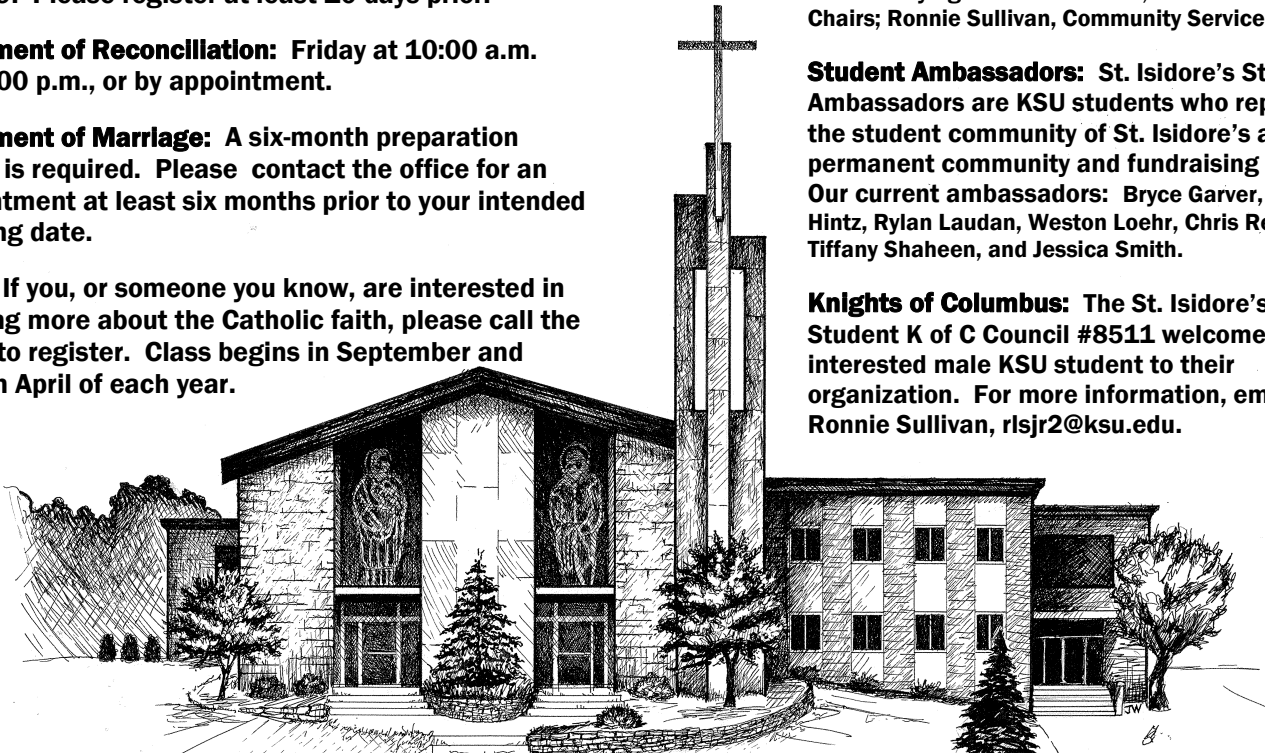

Next Sunday, the third Sunday of Lent, our catechumens, those who will be baptized into the Church, begin what are known as the Scrutinies. For three Sundays they are called forth and given special prayers. These will take place at the Masses on Feb. 28, at 11:00 a.m. when they will receive the Creed; March 6 at the 6:00 p.m. Mass when they will be blessed; and Saturday, March 12, at the 5:00 p.m. Mass when they will receive the Our Father.

These rites of the Church are part of the journey of faith in the RCIA, and I ask your prayers for the catechumens as well as the candidates (those already baptized who will enter the Catholic Church), their sponsors and the RCIA team.

Third Pillar: Study

The word "study" frequently has meant disciplined reading and memorizing cold information. For St. Dominic, however, study was something else: a way of going beyond a rote or pious understanding of Christian faith. Dominic sent his first followers to the universities. A university then was something new in Europe, a place where one could learn about the Christian tradition and about contemporary science. Albert the Great and his student Thomas Aquinas were at the forefront of showing how faith and theology in a time of university science could speak to a new time with its ideas and challenges.

Study for Dominicans means learning better what the Gospels are saying about Jesus and then expressing that in different ways. It means learning about the issues in one's own world (the only world that exists now) and making the teaching of Jesus alive and appealing for today.

Over the past eight centuries Dominicans have brought together cultures with the Catholic tradition: in the Spanish Dominicans' defense of the native Americans; in different approaches to the spiritual life like those of Catherine of Siena and Meister Eckhart; in the development of ecumenism, East and West; in the unfolding of lay ecclesial ministry; and in meeting the challenges of social change in modern times.

Study is intellectual light set free in a cultural world.
