RCIA: If you, or someone you know, are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please call the office to register. Class begins in September and ends in April of each year.

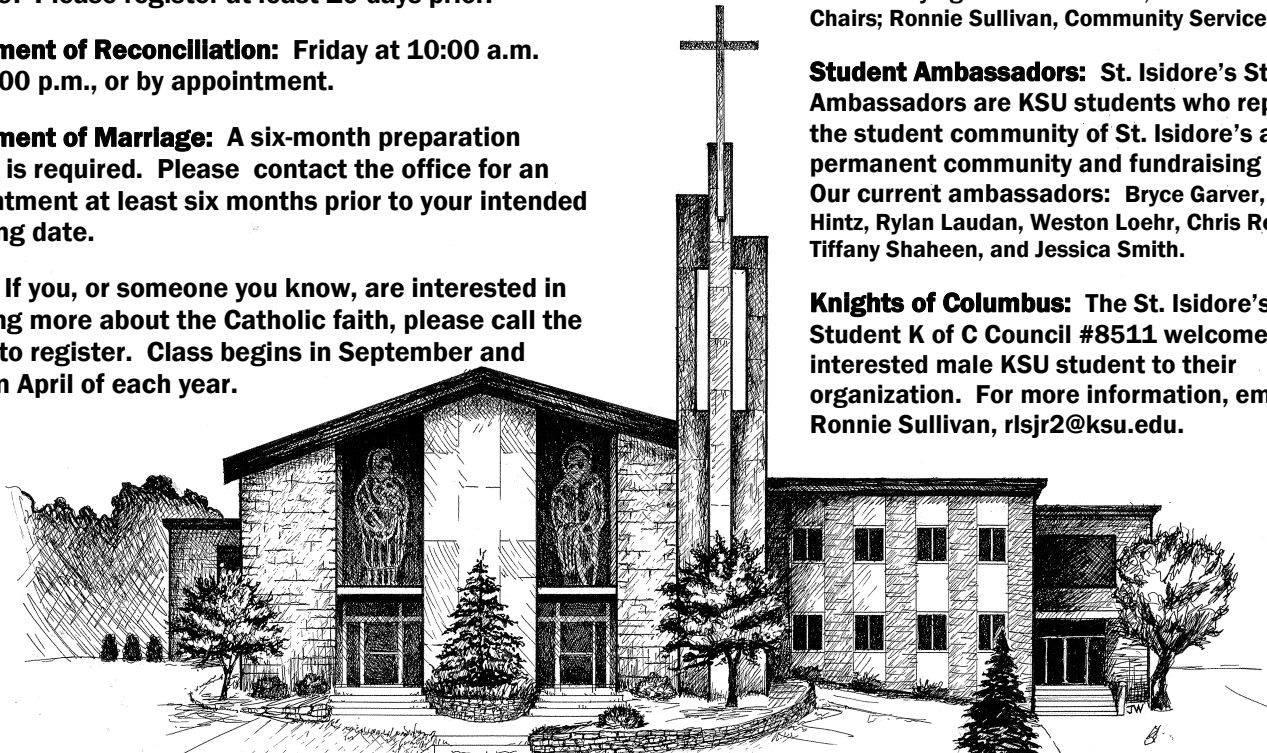

Fourth Pillar: Preaching

As Dominican Father Yves Congar once noted, if there were two countries, one with only the Mass and one with only preaching, the faith would be stronger in the country with only preaching. This is not to diminish the importance of our sacraments, but only to stress that it is preaching *that gets us to the sacraments*, especially reconciliation and Eucharist. If there were no preaching, eventually no one would understand what the sacraments meant. St. Dominic founded the Order of Preachers to preach – to help people understand the truths of the faith, to deepen their love of God and to lead them to the sacraments.

Everything Dominicans do -- study, prayer, community life -- is for the sake of preaching. We are called to be men and women of the Word. We immerse ourselves in the Word, we "eat the Word," as the prophet Ezekiel did (Ez 3:1), in order to make it available to others.

Good preaching has three qualities: it must focus on the Scriptural word; it must relate that word to the lives of those who hear it today; and it must move us to action. It is important to remember that preaching is a dialogue between the preacher and the congregation, so hearers of the Word have a role to play as well. They too must study and meditate on the Word of Scripture and come prepared to hear what God is telling them.
