RCIA: If you, or someone you know, are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please call the office to register. Class begins in September and ends in April of each year.

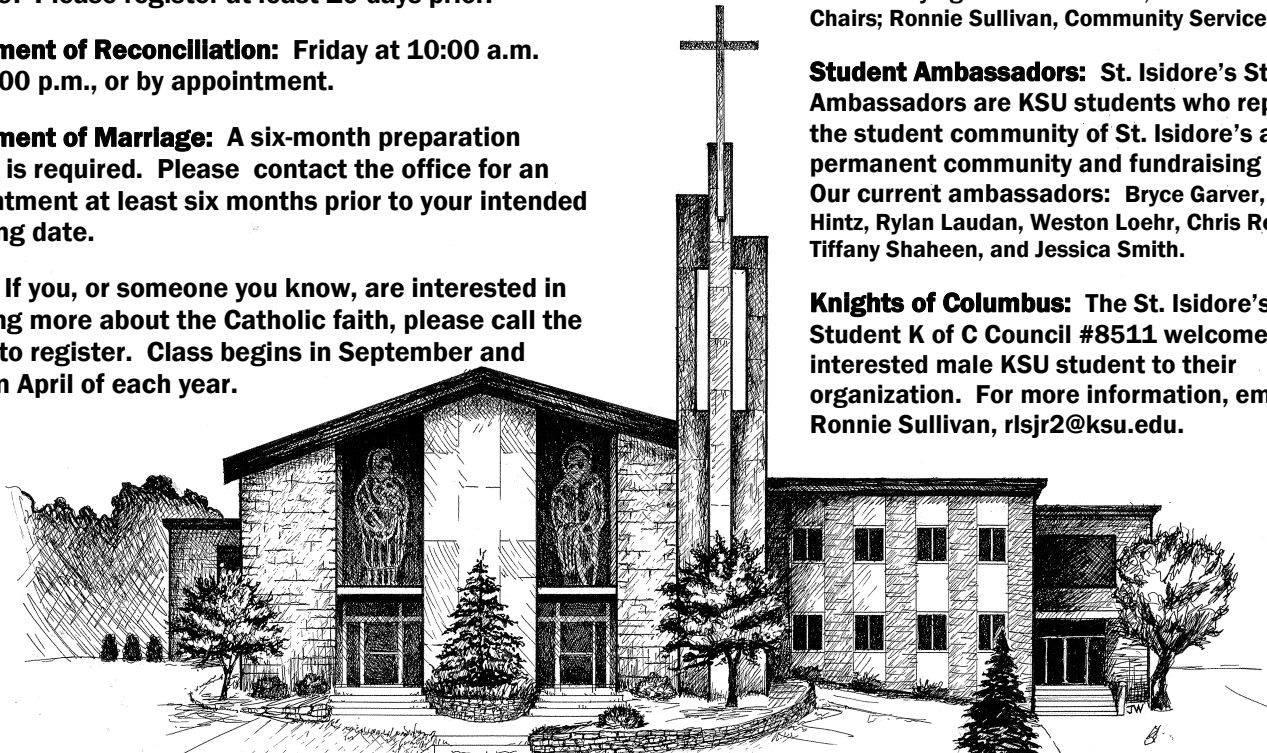

The Nuns of the Order of Preachers

The Fundamental Constitutions of the Nuns tells us that “The nuns of the Order of Preachers came into being when our holy Father Dominic gathered women converts to the Catholic faith in the Monastery of Blessed Mary of Prouille. These women, free for God alone, he associated with his ‘holy preaching’ by their prayer and penance.”

The earliest small band of women were converts. They knew the troubled times, they knew the needs. Like their father Dominic, they would lift up their lives as an offering – their hands to work – the work of prayer – their voices to praise – and to cry out for all in need – to proclaim by their lives the truth, the love, the beauty and joy of God. Their great desire was for the vision of God, the Kingdom of God. This was Dominic’s desire. It lives on in the Nuns, in their contemplative lives --for the Order, the Church, the world. “In the midst of the Church their growth in charity is mysteriously fruitful for the growth of the people of God.

Worldwide we nuns number about 2,775 in 189 monasteries. Immensely blest to be part of so great a family, may we be grateful and faithful. The Mystery of God beckons. Perhaps some young women who read this may experience the desire to join us in the unique adventure of a life of love.
