RCIA: If you, or someone you know, are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, please call the office to register. Class begins in September and ends in April of each year.

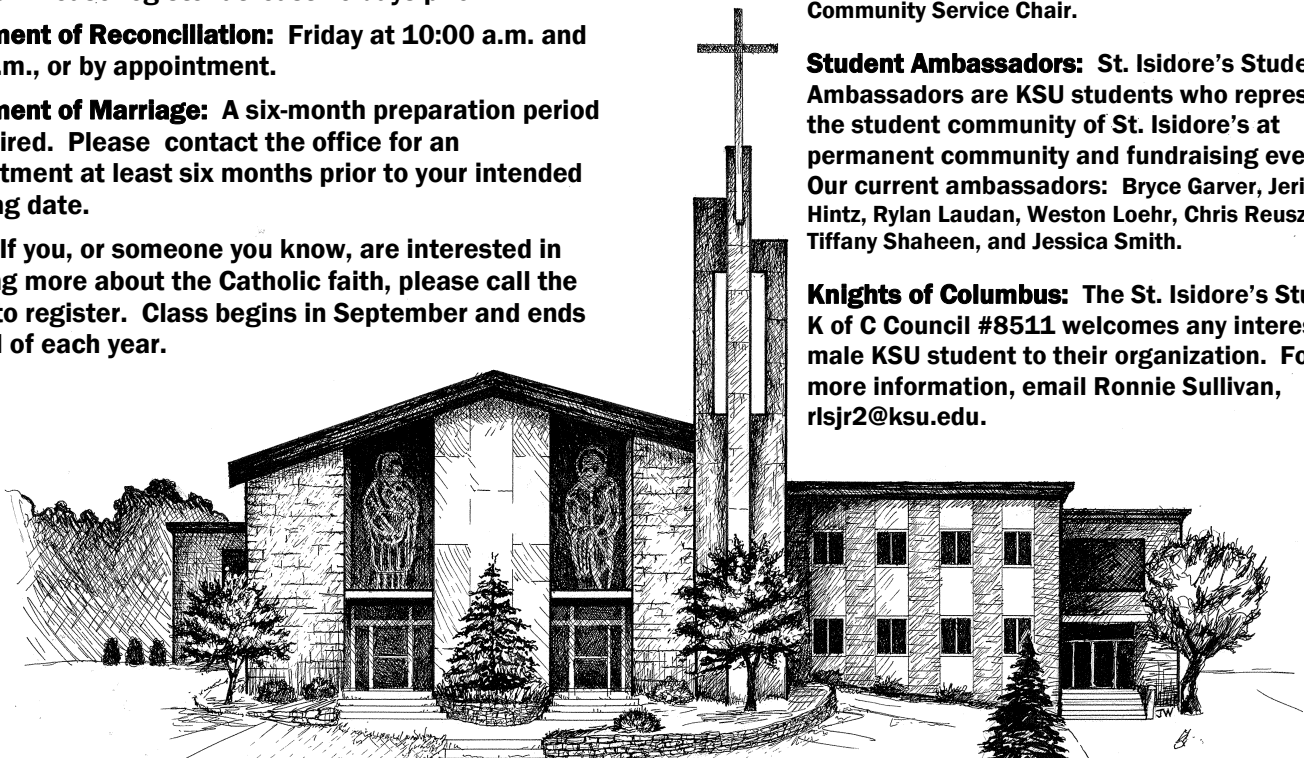

"Jesus said, 'My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.' How blessed we are to be the "sheep" of such a Good Shepherd! Jesus promises that "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." When we follow the voice of our Shepherd, he leads us exactly where we want to go. But, of course, it's up to us to make sure that we recognize this voice. In today's culture, many voices are competing for our attention. The voice of the media is a loud one, entering our homes and families through television, the Internet, print materials, and so on. We are also more and more a culture whose ears are literally filled with the voices of our favorite singers and the sounds of our personal playlists--the sight of people marching through their day with earphones blocking out other sounds is now a common sight. All of this has its appropriate place. We simply need to be sure that we don't allow these voices to become the primary ones in our lives.

To hear the voice of Jesus, we need to encounter his word in the Bible where he speaks to us loud and clear. We need to fill our ears with the message of the Gospel, to listen attentively to the prayers and preaching at Mass, and to "tune in" to the teaching of the Church and of the Holy Father, which is easily available to anyone these days through those same media outlets mentioned above. All of these things will help us to stay close to our Shepherd, and to avoid going astray into regions where we might get lost in spite of ourselves. Jesus promises of those who hear his voice and follow him that, "No one can take them out of my hand." When we stay near the Lord, we can rest assured that he will fulfill his promises.

Meister Eckhart

Friar Eckhart von Hochheim was the central figure in the mystical movement known as "The Friends of God" at the turn of the 14th century in

southern Germany and northern Switzerland.

Eckhart was born around 1260. He entered the Order at Erfurt around 1275 and after completing initial studies went on to Cologne, where he met St. Albert the Great. He next studied at the University of Paris, where after an absence as Prior of Erfurt, he returned in 1298 and received the coveted title Master in Theology in 1302.

Eckhart quickly gained a reputation for his preaching and scholarly work. He was an able administrator and was elected provincial of two provinces and prior at least twice. He was also charged by the Master of the Order with the work of reforming houses and directing the spiritual lives of the Dominican nuns of the southern Rhineland. Eckhart was arguably the greatest preacher of his generation, but in 1326 he was accused in Cologne of promoting false doctrine. He defended himself at the papal court at Avignon but died before the process ended.

After his death, Eckhart's teaching was cautiously carried on by his disciples, Bl. Henry Seuse (Suso) and John Tauler, as well as other Dominican friars, nuns, and laity. He is now regarded by many historians and spiritual writers as "the Prince of Medieval Mystics."
