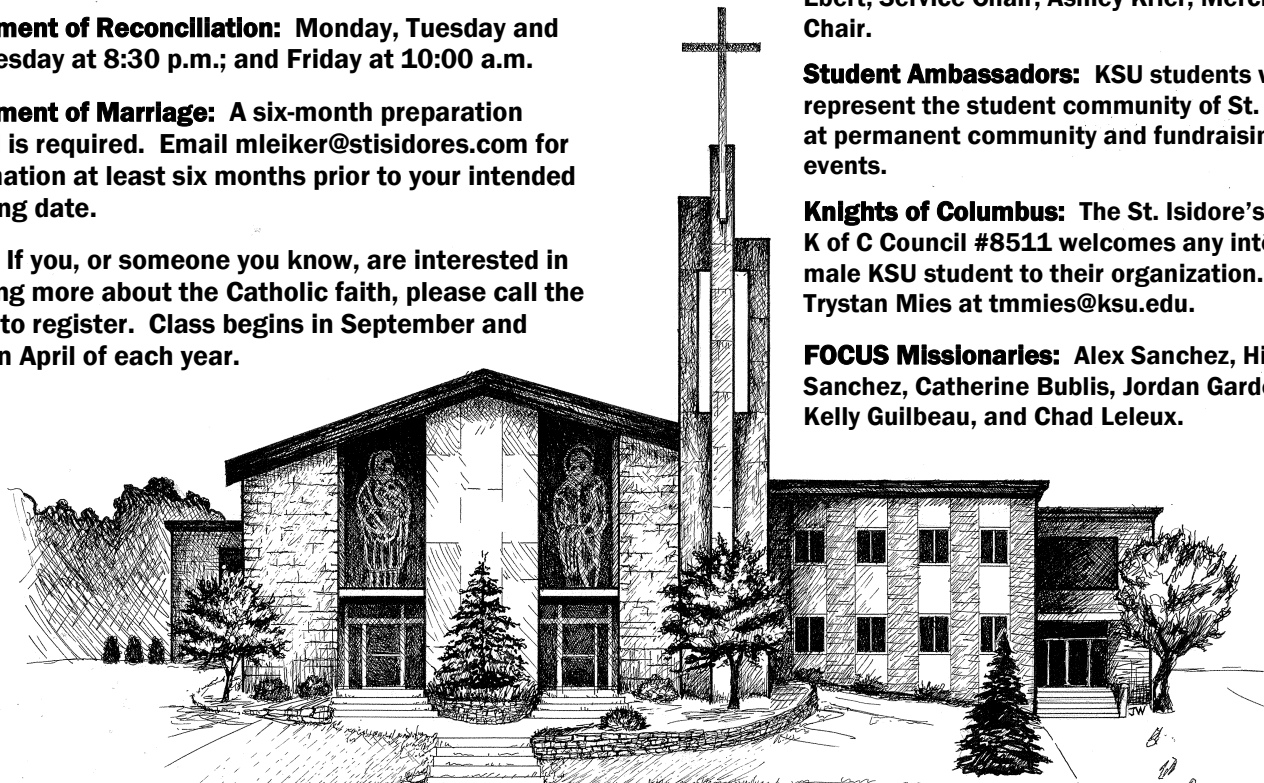

"And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church."
Simon got a new name after his profession of faith. As soon as he declared to Jesus, *"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God,"* Jesus renamed him with a title that means *"rock."* And with that name he gave Peter the mission to be a solid foundation upon which he would build *his* church. Not Peter's church. Not James or Paul's church. Not Martin Luther's or John Calvin's or anybody else's. This is Jesus' church, the church of Christ himself, that we call the Catholic Church.

So it was Christ himself who desired to give authority in the church—*"the keys to the kingdom of heaven"*—to a human leader. Peter was thus established as the first pope. He exercised a special kind of headship, within the community of the apostles and the church at large, because Jesus gave him the power to do so, not because Peter claimed it for himself. And so too every pope since, right down to our Holy Father today, exercises this unique leadership within the Church.

What a gift this is to us! Jesus knew well the human tendency to squabble and disagree, to argue and compete. He knew that the church would be prone to all of this because of her members, and that providing a final voice of authority, saying in effect that *"the buck stops here"* would be helpful for maintaining unity. As Catholics, even in spite of the differing opinions and perspectives that are manifest in the Church, we nonetheless maintain a strong sense of identity and belief thanks in large part to the papacy. Today, may we give thanks for the pope and pray for him as he strives to lead all of us closer and closer to Christ.

Emergency Second Collection This Weekend

All parishes of the Diocese of Salina will be taking up a second collection this weekend to help with the immense financial losses from the hail storm of two weeks ago in the WaKeeney area. One insurance company alone has totaled 700 cars from the softball-size hail. Almost every roof in WaKeeney and the surrounding area has had extensive room damage or was completely destroyed. Many working people could afford only liability insurance on their cars or have high insurance deductibles. Getting to work is critical, and a working automobile is among the highest needs. Other storm victims had inadequate or no home insurance. Limited, emergency repairs are likewise critical to secure their homes and prevent additional damage. All financial assistance will be supervised through the Hays office of our Diocesan Catholic Charities who will have applications for those requesting help. Assistance will be especially focused on assisting with emergency car and home repairs. I am very truly grateful for your generosity for our brothers and sisters here in our own Diocese.

Listening Session for Young Adults

The next Synod of Bishops in Rome is on the topic of "Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment." In preparation for the Synod, Pope Francis has asked that each diocese enter into a consultation with young adults to determine their concerns, issues, and interests. I will not be making a presentation or responding to issues surfaced. Rather, I am directed solely to listen to you, the Catholic young adults of our community, to discern your views on these issues. In light of that approach, I will be hosting a listening session for young adults on Sept. 5 at St. Isidore's Catholic Student Center, starting at 7:30 p.m., followed by Mass. Following the session, I will be forwarding a report to the Holy See. Issues we will address are related to: the main challenges and opportunities for young Catholic people in our Diocese; common concerns young adults struggle with; how our Catholic Student Centers contribute to young adult's formation and vocation discernment; young adults interaction with clergy; interactions with friends and family members who have left the Church; and most importantly, identifying the key issues the Church should be looking at today from the perspective of young adults.
