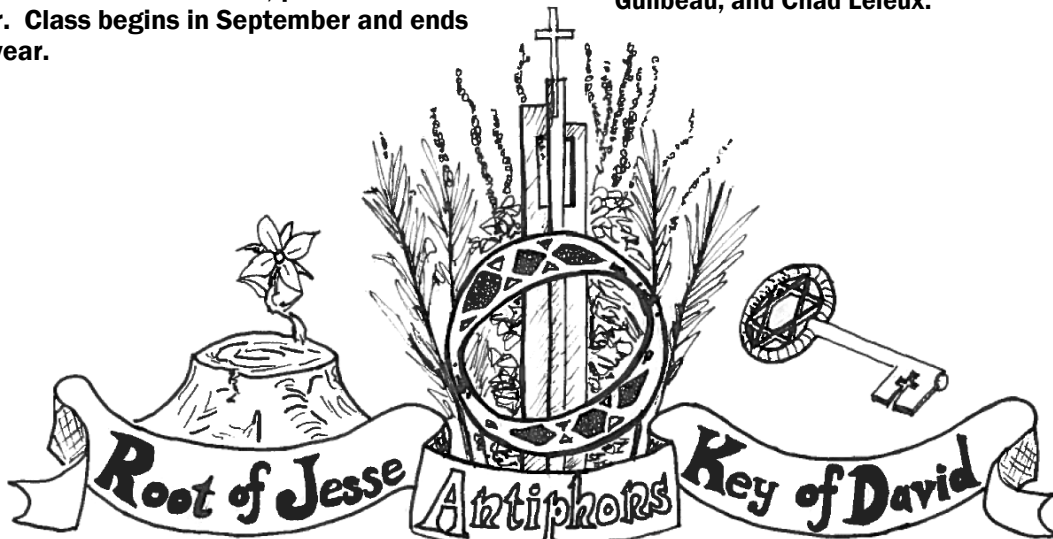

Second Sunday of Advent



The O Antiphons are used seasonally during Advent most commonly during the seven days before Christmas, from December 17 to December 24, in the Church's *Liturgy of the Hours*. The antiphons anticipate the coming of the Lord by unfolding the mystery of the story of salvation history.

This season of Advent, our bulletin cover will feature two antiphons illustrated by Fr. Ryan McCandless each weekend. Each illustration is inspired by the early practice known as Illuminated Manuscript, detailed artwork that accompanied written work usually done by monks.

O Root of Jesse. Latin: *O Radix Jesse*

Symbols: Flower with roots or stump.

It is from a royal lineage that the Savior will come.

O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid. Isaiah had prophesied, "But a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom" (Isaiah 11:1), and, "On that day, the root of Jesse, set up as a signal for the nations, the Gentiles shall seek out, for his dwelling shall be glorious" (Isaiah 11:10). Remember also that Jesse was the father of King David, and Micah had prophesied that the Messiah would be of the house and lineage of David and be born in David's city, Bethlehem (Micah 5:1).

O Key of David. Latin: *O Clavis David*

Symbols: Key

The authority of power is handed down in each generation.

O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel controlling at your will the gate of Heaven: Come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom. Isaiah had prophesied, "I will place the Key of the House of David on His shoulder; when he opens, no one will shut, when he shuts, no one will open" (Isaiah 22:22), and "His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, from Davids throne, and over His kingdom, which he confirms and sustains by judgment and justice, both now and forever" (Isaiah 9:6).

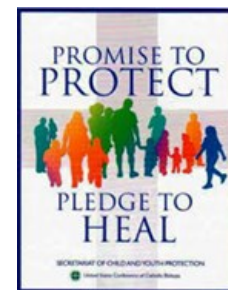
